1. Opening statement of the President

IF welcomes all attendees and new representatives of National Associations

3. Executive Committee Report

3.1 Meetings EC

IF report attached; At the most recent count there are 33.645 members and 40 countries in EMDR Europe

EC meeting monthly; due to amount of work the EC cannot respond immediately to specific requests but each will be responded to within the month.

Action: All National Associations to send matters to be discussed by the Executive Committee to Sofia Mariani (sofia.mariani@emdr-europe.org)

3.2 Report Vitol Foundation

Report shown in slides –

1.917 Sessions provided, 18.965 people reached, 17.802 people attended online courses

3.3 Trainings Ukraine

EMDRE has been funding and supporting many trainings in Ukraine since the start of the war.

Marzena Oledzka Trainer and Oksana Nakonechna have been facilitators in the recent trainings.

EE is responsive to requests for training in Poland for Ukrainian clinicians staying in Poland.

It was important to train them in EMDR so they can support Ukrainian refugees staying in Poland.

3.4 Trademark

IF asks all members to use logo of EMDR Europe in all documentation; if 33, 645 members used the logo it would be strong; EMDR Europe receives an alert if someone tries to register the logo with word “EMDR”. We have to evaluate each time if the trademark could damage others, by not allowing them to use the nomination (For instance “EMDR Centre” or “EMDR Istanbul”). We need to differentiate a trademark and a name of a company; EMDREA have to challenge the use of EMDR in a generic manner, have to send a “cease and desist” letter and this costs significant money from EMDR Europe; if members want to register a trademark they need to register it in a narrow way, not in a generic manner. Everybody is invited to use the logo of EMDR Europe Association.

OPM -suggests that NAs discuss this with members and inform them of the need to use the logo.

IF- if members use EMDREA logo they are protected and do not have to register it as trademark; please promote the use of EMDREA logo in certificates, announcements of trainings, any activities of NAs and membership.

EK -EMDR Turkey asks for clarification on broad and narrow definition; IF gave clarification.

Action: All National Associations to promote the use of the EMDR Europe logo and remind members not to apply for general trademarks with the name EMDR in it.

3.5 Project Moldova War Child and Kazakhstan

3.5.1 EMDR Europe received contact from War Child charity working in Moldova and we will be working together providing training to those eligible.

3.5.2 Kazakhstan – there is a group trying to organise a EMDR Kazakhstan; they have contacted EMDRIA and EMDR Asia, as well as EMDR Europe; there is ongoing discussion and issues are to be clarified.

Julia Malik has planned to do training in Kazakhstan

IF raised concerns about the issue of Kazakhstan applying to be part of EMDRIA.
The Executive Committee is trying to liaise with the group in Kazakhstan; IF will also discuss with Global Alliance and EMDRIA as a matter of urgency; IF hopes for a positive outcome.

Action: IF is communicating with organisation within Kazakhstan and also with Global Alliance and EMDRIA.

3.6 Death of Frances Haour

EMDR Europe sent condolences to her and family; IF asked Leonard Ametepe (EMDR France President) to read a tribute to the meeting; IF made a response on behalf of EMDR Europe and sent flowers to her funeral on behalf of EMDREA and highlighted how EMDR Europe deeply valued her work; Board meeting had one minute silence in her memory.

3.7 EMDR All Cyprus

Zihila Uluboy gave outline of development after Valencia; an All Cyprus group was established and is currently working on the constitution; Photini Ipsmiller-Demetriou agreed. It is valuable to work together to create a new Association. This is a challenging situation as there is no official recognition of Greek Cypriots and Turkish Cypriots. Photini Ipsmiller-Demetriou enquired when it is possible to make application; IF confirmed this could take place in June 2023.

IF grateful for work unifying the EMDR clinicians; working for the good of the population despite the challenges.

Ziliha Uluboy asked if EMDRE could provide financial support to translate the Constitution and the documents in Greek and Turkish from English

OPM responded that this can be discussed within EC.

Action: Request for translation to be discussed at the next EC meeting.

Emre K – EMDR Turkey supports this development for EMDR all Cyprus; EMDR Turkey can give financial support.

IF clarified that this can be considered as a special project with EMDR All Cyprus, even if they are not full members yet; IF thanks all parties involved including those from EMDR Turkey and EMDR Greece.

3.8 Resignations

IF shares resignation letter from Derek Farrell; he worked for 16 years in EMDR Europe in many roles and giving a special contribution to the development of EMDREA; IF wrote a letter thanking him for the work he has done.

Gyða Eyjólfsdóttir (Iceland) resigned from board EMDR Iceland and as national rep for family reasons, IF wrote to her on behalf of the board thanking her for her work. EMDR Iceland will have elections in November and will inform EMDREA who will be the next representative to the Board.

3.9 EMDR Greece

Has had challenges with Trauma Aid Netherlands; Vassiliki Sfyri gave update; Trauma Aid Netherlands wanted to train people working with MSF (Medicins sans frontiers); Domna V (President EMDR Greece) refused as no one asked permission of EMDR Greece; despite some initial discussions dialogue has stopped at the moment.

Query by board if Trauma Aid Netherlands belongs to Trauma Aid Europe?

It was confirmed by colleagues from EMDR Netherlands that Judit Koopmans is *not* a trainer. It was also confirmed by Penny P. (Greece) that TAE did was not aware of this initiative.

Annemieke Driessen EMDR Netherlands was not aware of this issue as well and will contact the person involved.

Action Vassiliki Sfyri will share the information with EMDR Netherlands, Annemieke, to explore this issue.

EMK – on one hand initiatives to do good things are of course appreciated, but at the same time there is a need to respect regulations of EMDR Europe; need to ask the permission of the National Association.

MC -all NAs deserve autonomy and respect.

OPM – queried what are aims of Trauma Aid Europe (previously it only worked with countries who did not have their own National Association).

A query was also raised who is now representative of Trauma Aid Europe on the EMDR Europe board?

Trauma Aid Europe will be asked to keep EMDR Europe Board updated on their activities.

CdR sought clarification “was the training offered an EMDR training or a psych traumatology training?”.

IF confirmed it was both.

Vassiliki Sfyri thanked IF for helping.

Action: Executive Committee to ask Trauma Aid Europe to clarify their aims and who is their representative on the EMDR Europe Board?

EMDR Netherlands to get into contact with TA Netherlands to clarify the situation.

3.10 EMDR Ukraine

Oksana Nakonechna communicated us that she will not attend EMDR Europe Board meetings as National Representative as EMDR Russia is part of EMDR Europe.

IF clarified EMDR Europe is *not* a political association;

IF confirmed that EMDR Ukraine wanted EMDR Russia to be expelled; the EC clarified for EMDR Ukraine how this process could happen according to the constitution (need 8 countries to agree to the proposition and two thirds of board have to agree to exclude a member)

“3.3.4 The Executive Committee or a minimum of one fifth of the Full Member Associations shall have the right to recommend to the EMDR Europe Board the suspension (for a defined period of time) or exclusion of a Member. The suspension or exclusion shall be valid if two thirds of the Full Member Associations accept the recommendation. An exclusion without declaration of the reason(s) is permitted”

Although EMDR Ukraine is not attending this EMDR Europe board meeting and other meetings of border countries working for Ukraine, EMDR Europe is willing to continue to support EMDR Ukraine.

Julia Malik(EMDR Russia) – she stated she understands Oksana’s feelings and the feelings of all Ukrainians; she recognises the enormity of the situation ; she stated that sadness adds to collective trauma ; she highlighted a humanitarian project , 10, 000 participants who received group EMDR sessions online ; when started there were laws prohibiting treating Ukrainian people; despite this Ukrainian people have been treated ; JM read a letter by one of volunteers providing the online treatment stated that 100-600 people attend each meeting ; people are unaware which country attendees come from however one attendee shared message from an Ukrainian client from the humanitarian project , 70-200 people Ukrainians attending the project

This project is also treating soldiers who are wounded and their families;

JM confirmed 1 million Russians left Russia.

IF asks for comments from Board members

JM had written a statement message in February 22, which had been resent to EMDR Ukraine.

UO – JM and people in EMDR Russia are already doing work; appreciate work that both sides are doing.

KN- understand EMDR Ukraine position; would be useful to have letter from EMDR Europe board.

GM – Is EMDR Ukraine willing to continue to accept support from EMDR Europe?

IF informed the board that they were accepting the support at present.

MC points out that EMDR Europe has been supportive and open towards EMDR Ukraine.
RM- understand position of EMDR Ukraine and a letter from EMDR Europe would be helpful.
Having meetings with all the border countries always invite EMDR Ukraine, as it is for them.
Roger Solomon raising money for Ukraine projects; Luca Ostacoli going to Lviv doing seminars;
IF will keep channel open with EMDR Ukraine.

Action: Executive Committee will send a draft message and circulate to Board members prior to sending to EMDR Ukraine. It will be signed by the whole Board of EMDREA. The Executive Committee has written already letters to EMDR Ukraine, supporting them but sending a letter from the whole Board could be more important for them.

3.11 EMDR Armenia

Due to war Roger Solomon and Gary Quinn offer training financially supported by EMDREA – Nov 4/5 ;
feedback from Anush G ; she thanked EMDR Europe for the support.
Roger S– will provide training on how to treat victims of war, torture and rape.
EK - EMDR Turkey offer support/ training pro bono; IF thanks EK.

3.12 EMDREA Consultants Training

23 candidates have taken part in Consultant Training - Poland has 4 more; Slovakia 2; Portugal has 2;
Dolores Mosquera provided training with facilitators.
IF asked if any further requests for eligible people to attend from National Associations from low income countries; EMDREA will organise another training for next year.

Action: Eligible National Associations will write request to SM (sofia.mariani@emdr-europe.org) and MC (maeve.crowley@emdr-europe.org).

4. EECC report (Slide 1)

4.1 EMDR Workshop Conference 2022

BM shows slides of Valencia workshop conference.
82 countries took part, half online and half on-site.
-Final balance 507,000 euros Profit 90, 000 euro. Hybrid conference is worth the cost.
EECC will make a plan to have EMDR book sellers at the next conference;
-Delegate's survey – small number of responses so far; conference committee discussing how to encourage more responses.

4.5. EMDR Workshop Conference 2024

Dublin: BM informed the Board there have been problems with the conference venue for 2024 in Dublin.

OPM – conference committee became aware 3 days ago; if conference centre will not facilitate the conference it may have to be moved from Dublin; will have plan B for Prague.

EK – queried if hybrid will continue; IF confirmed this would continue.

IF stated there continued to be a price reduction for low income countries; confirmed can have interpreters .

BM/ IF confirmed low-income fee as usual.

GM shocked that Dublin may be cancelled. OPM confirmed it does not depend on EMDREA, but rather the Conference venue in Dublin.

UO congratulated Conf committee and Executive Committee; he is concerned that a third of conference profit goes to Kuoni; he urges the Conference Committee to renegotiate.

BM confirmed that will review cost and has also compared the cost with other organisations.

EMK – suggested Dublin is a desirable conference location and queried the possibility of changing the dates to enable us have the conference; OPM confirmed this is not possible.

OPM – wanted to clarify issues he stated the size of our conferences are small for conference centres; 20% profit is good, decided to lower fee for attendees; if Dublin is not possible in 2024, the cost would increase to 260, 000 in 2025.

OPM -Before Krakow conferences organised by NA , since then we have employed Kuoni; conference venues price has increased ; need to be more proactive and plan conferences (date and locations) in advance for next 4/5 years ; there was a rule that countries where conference takes place would receive part of profit , this would be unfair for some countries who have not been able to host ; over the next 4/5 years we will try to have a balance between east, west, north / south , expensive/less expensive in Europe ; Norway has proposed to host a conference and Copenhagen is another possibility ; OPM asked board members views.

Markus H – Finland -agrees with proposal.

Katharine D – Germany- good idea.

Emre K – good idea; value of online.

Beatrice S – Austria; limit in-person places and others can participate online.

OPM -usually we can expect 1000.

BM- stated it is not good to limit in person attendees.

OPM- need to continue with hybrid.

Julia M -Russia – agree it is the future.

Svetlana L North Macedonia – agreed value of hybrid.

Maria R– Sweden asked the committee to explore the possibility of travelling to the conference by train

EMK – should review balance over the years vs 1 year.

UO- seconds words of EMK; issue of profit not central, let as many as possible participate.

Leonard A France- asked if should there be a cheaper price for online participants

OPM – confirmed this was not possible last year as people could make a choice to attend in person or online late in the process due to the risk of being unable to travel due to Covid.

Kath N UK – agree to leave same price for online/ face to face.

Action: OPM suggests planning in advance the dates of the next conferences (at least 4-5 years before) and to explore alternative host countries to ensure equity.

5. Treasurer's report

5.1 Report Financial Prognosis 2022 (Slide 2)

Runs from Dec to Dec; balance will be in June.

KB – explore possibility of accessing interest on savings.

Markus H- Finland – asked why the office costs had increased?

IF confirmed due to resignation of Valentina M and payment of contractual taxes for job termination.
IF confirmed that the finances were in good shape that is why EMDR Europe wants to support projects.

5.2 Budget 2023 (Slide 3)

JH presented Budget 2023.

6. Nomination and Election Committee

6.1 Election of Vice – President

KBJ – call for nomination; 2 nominations, 1 not eligible.

40 counties; 33 present and 7 absent and 4 proxy; 37 votes in person.

Denmark, Ukraine absent without proxy votes.

The criteria to be elected on EC are to be part of the EMDR Europe Board or of the Executive Committee as experience is essential, for the role.

MC was elected as Co Vice President.

KBJ and IF congratulate MC for the election as Co Vice President.

7. Standard Committee report (Slide 4)

7.1 New trainers and training courses accredited since the last meeting

No objection and abstentions, therefore approved.

No objection and abstentions, therefore approved.

7.3 New C&A trainers accredited since the t meeting

No objection and abstentions, therefore approved.

7.4 New C&A Trainers courses reaccredited since the previous meeting

Kerstin Stellermann Strehlow – Germany

Susan Darker Smith – UK.

No objection and abstentions, therefore approved.

Working online – now as trainers do face -to -face trainings and it will be possible to compare the two, the process will be reviewed by the SC; online training is still allowed.

Ongoing work on “core of EMDR “–SC set up a subgroup to address it; will feed back at board meeting in Bologna.

Germany – CD question if supervision can happen online, this issue belongs to Practice Committee, but has never been in discussion and occurs currently.

IF meeting of Standards Committee very frequently, meet once every 2 months; working hard all year; lots emerging issues; key role in organisation.

8. OD&C Committee report(Slide 5)

Report from the OD&C

OPM will leave the role of chair in June 2023 and Joan Camilleri offered to be chair.

There are few members in the committee so they have to increase the number; after Dec 1st will approach people to invite them to be members.

IF asks NAs to think about prospective members.

OPM and MC explain the work to be done within the committee and what are the requirements to be part of a committee.

9. Practice Committee report (Slide 6)

IF shares resignation letter from Derek Farrell.

GM Vice Chair discussed his appreciation of role of DF.

EMK thanks to DF and GM for their essential contribution.

OPM stated that the goals of the Practice Committee can be reconsidered, will review by June 23, existing members will be asked for their opinion and there is a call for new members.

GM stated that any potential member needs knowledge of accreditation process; it involves a detailed job of reviewing documents.

IF stated that part of the work of Practice committee would be how to manage request for additional criteria as some countries are making it more difficult to become a Practitioner/Consultant; we need common criteria for every NA. Up to now we have had minimum criteria and NA can add to that, but it would be better to have definite criteria for all countries belonging to EMDREA.

JC Malta stated that in some countries psychotherapy governed by law;

RM stated that Standards are different throughout Europe and this is a NA issue; SC try to find lowest common denominator.

OPM raised the issue of discussing the goals of the Practice committee now; OPM confirmed that in past it was to develop Accreditation criteria; the recent survey shows there are not enough Practitioners/Consultants; this review may be taken over by Practice Committee;

EMK discussed how can existing criteria for Accreditation be applied and used in different countries; we have been dealing with this for 2 years.

CDR- pleased that OPM raised this issue to raise number of C&A Practitioner.

Action: The EC will develop a proposal regarding the future development of the Practice Committee.

10. Research Committee report(Slide 7)

Michael Hase – 2nd Research vol in Frontiers in Psychology – 16 articles and 39,000 views – very successful
MH raised concerns that it is hard to find reviewers for articles, especially to find reviewers outside field of EMDR.

Action: All NAs make a list of possible reviewers outside the field of EMDR who may be willing to review papers and forward these to MH.

EMDR related to pandemic; will have a review of this area.

Action: please keep MH informed of any research happening in NAs.

KBJ – good to get suggestions from others. It is a common challenge for all approaches to find reviewers for articles.

MH wants guidance from board on research streams -ED, Pain, pandemic, Depression.

Getting closer to guidelines.

MC invited MW UK to give update of how this was proceeding in UK – he clarified there were specific research streams; EMDR UK had a research officer to drive forward research agenda.

Researchers meeting – UK to be involved to discuss research.

Depression – 4 meta-analyses; conclusion from these is that the samples are too small. This implies EMDREA. should promote more research on effectiveness of EMDR with Depression.

IF stated we need to define work streams related to research.

Emre K – using Masters / Doctoral students being funded to do EMDR research.

Joan C- Malta; did 2 Bachelors and 1 Masters in EMDR.

Carolyn D Roos – Depression study happening within Council of Scholars.

MH – propose using cost effectiveness studies.

IF raised issues with Dutch study looking at effectiveness of EMDR compared to EMDR 2.0 and flash technique with PTSD. This will not add anything to the development of EMDR since it is already recognized as effective for PTSD.

MC stated that research that prioritises clinically related studies is very valuable as the national guidelines require this.

EMK highlighted 4 issues :

1. All the committee reports are proposals to the board, which is the governing and deciding body; and always proposals have been discussed and also been changed, it is within the EMDREA regulations, the committees report to the EC and the EMDR Europe Board.

2: suggested the value of study exploring physical symptoms in addition to the mentioned diagnoses

3: EC has asked for that regular reviews of outcome studies and publications coming from EMDR Europe funded projects.

4: grant decisions for studies should take issue of scientific quality, content (target groups relevant for EMDR?) and political issues into consideration, RC makes proposals based on scientific quality only.

MH: in response to issue 3: is aware of the need to provide a review of the outcome studies and publications funded by EMDR Europe; this will be provided for June EMDREA Board meeting.

The Board voted for exclusion of the last study and to divide the money among the other proposals.

Discussion on grant proposals; impact of relevance and publication.

Research Committee will devise guidelines for the EMDR website to clarify the research priorities and motivate researchers to do research.

MH discussed important paper on the treatment of children with ACES – IGTEP – led to symptom improvement and change in epigenetics; published in Nature (2nd research showing impact of EMDR on epigenetics).

Markus H – well planned study scientifically, supported by study.

Udi O- commented that there are 3/ 4 studies related to PTSD; he alleges that the decision against Suzy M is a political decision; he is of the view that the final proposal is related to “what is EMDR?”.

IF states that it is not political but a practical issue of the title and purpose of this study. EMDR Europe is willing to support other research from Suzy M that are important for EMDR. Her work and the work of Dutch researchers are often awarded by EMDREA and we appreciate openly their commitment to research.

MH- the 6th study reinforces the research we already have; aware there is good data on working memory, may not add to what is already there.

Annemike D – hard to vote re studies when there is limited information; the focus on EMDR research priorities need to be clear.

Kath N – funding for research in the UK in the past was more ad hoc; now we have focused on what can be prioritised; want research prove efficacy treating other conditions.

KBJ- confirmed research committee specialised in evaluating applications; all agreed.

IF -clarified that EMDR Europe is giving 50,000 euros every year for research this has to be discussed at the EMDR Europe board as board members have responsibility for the final decision.

OPM – Invites Research committee to make a proposal of research streams to board June 2023.

CdR- Highlighted the issue of effectiveness.

OPM suggests a vote to accept first 5 proposals; this has been accepted by a majority of those board members eligible to vote, 4 were against, no abstentions.

Action:

Research committee to provide a review of outcome studies and publications funded by EMDR Europe by June 2023 Board meeting.

Research committee to propose suggestions for research priorities for June 2023 Board meeting.

11. C&A Committee report (Slide 8)

CdR – very impressive organisation related to training.

In most countries there are C&A reps in board.

Range of C&A Practitioner across countries 0 -663.

Working to combine generic training and level 1.

Generic and C&A work together; generic part 1 integrated, 5 days vs 4.

C&A Consultant Training – Joanne Morris Smith and Michel Sylvestre, add onto generic training.

IF thanked committee for their work and useful findings.

What are the needs in Ukraine and border countries?.

Action : CdR to send document to trainers and IF asked CdR to do a presentation at trainers day.

GM – what is status of C&A Consultant Training? GM stated it should be discussed by Practice Committee.

CdJ says unclear where it is written; RM confirmed it's a Standard committee issue.

16 internationally trained C&A consultants; next training April 28/29 2023.

for countries when C&A is not present.

Child Trainers Training – 13 have been trained.

IF: Italy trained 30 C&A Consultants and from now on will be able to have more C&A practitioners in the next months.

CdR doing lots of presentations, as are members of the committee.

Transition phase from current position to having C&A specific training – each NA to discuss the impact of this.

Action: NAs to discuss how to transition from current position to a specific C&A consultant training

CdR discussed Research on children aged 1 and half to 8 years old, which is due to be published in June.

CdR- there is also research related to EMDR and Depression.

OPM– Gave update on Alliance for Childhood lobbying group, next year will be designated as the Year of mental health and there will, be a specific focus on trauma.

Action: OPM will approach CdR to discuss contributing to the event.
